

Alberta July 7th, 2020

Record of decision of the Chief Medical Officer of Health requiring that any person who is a confirmed case of COVID-19 be in isolation for a minimum of 10 days from the start of their symptoms, or until symptoms resolve, whichever is longer. Also requires that any person returning to Alberta after having travelled internationally, and any person who is a close contact of a person who is confirmed as having COVID-19, must be in quarantine for a minimum 14-day period.

Requires the Calgary Airport Authority and the Edmonton Regional Airports Authority to implement public health measures related to cleaning, disinfecting and physical distancing. It further requires the airport authorities to enable passenger screening of travellers returning from international locations.

Certain requirements in Chief Medical Officer of Health order 18-2020 and 19-2020 should not be necessary for all businesses, entities, places of worship and schools, and should be replaced with specific guidance they can implement as a best practice.

Therefore, this CMOH Order rescinds the requirement in section 11 of Order 18-2020 and section 19 of Order 19-2020 for operators to create and post a plan to meet the requirements of these Orders. Section 6 of Order 19-2020 was rescinded by Order 22-2020.

Therefore, this CMOH Order rescinds the requirement in section 6 of Order 19-2020 for operators to create and post a plan to meet the requirements of the Order. CMOH Order 21-2020 rescinded section 19.

Record of Decision of the Chief Medical Officer which rescinds the following CMOH Orders: 01-2020, 02-2020, 07-2020, 15-2020, 16-2020, 17-2020, 18-2020, 19-2020, 20-2020 and 24-2020 as part of Stage 2 relaunch.

CMOH Order 25-2020 is effective June 12, 2020 and applies throughout the Province of Alberta.

Record of decision of the Chief Medical Officer of Health outlining updated operational and outbreak standards for residential addiction treatment service providers. The intent of these standards is to help prevent the spread of infection while allowing individuals to continue to receive treatment and overcome their addiction.
