AHS pandemic response started three years ago

Physical distancing still recommended

Physical distancing continues to be recommended in all AHS settings to limit the spread of respiratory disease. This includes patient considerating Continues to de recommendate a rain rain setting to a limit the speak of the spiratory cases or in a necessity and common spaces, including the caleteria, staff rooms, in waiting areas, and when meeting with colleagues. Clinical staff should perform a point of care risk assessment to protect themselves and others by using the appropriate PPE when physical distancing cannot be maintained. Our continuous masking directive remains in place at all AHS facilities provincewide. All staff members are required to wear procedure masks when contact with patients can be anticipated. This includes staff who walk through patient care areas to access their workspace. Non-clinical staff are required to don a mask prior to entering any AHS workplace or facility and to remain wearing it until they are in their cubicle or office, behind an appropriate barrier, or otherwise appropriately distanced from others.


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




