Deena Hinshaw was never at AHS with Mauro Chies as CEO.

Mark Joffe (CMOH Alberta) - Holds the Government position of Chief Medical Officer of Health but is paid by AHS (still taxpayer money). This is a clear conflict of Interest.

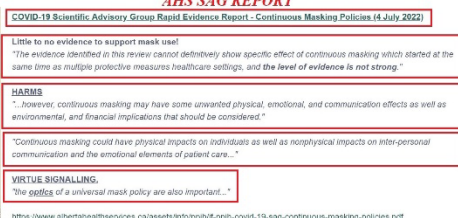

Physical distancing still recommended

Physical distancing continues to be recommended in all AHS settings to limit the spread of respiratory disease. This includes patient care areas, non-clinical areas and common spaces, including the cafeteria, staff rooms, in waiting areas, and when meeting with colleagues. Clinical staff should perform a [point of care risk assessment](#) to protect themselves and others by using the [appropriate PPE](#) when physical distancing cannot be maintained. Our [continuous masking guidance](#) remains in place at all AHS facilities province-wide. All staff members are required to wear procedure masks when contact with patients can be anticipated. This includes staff who walk through patient care areas to access their workspace. Non-clinical staff are required to don a mask prior to entering any AHS workplace or facility and to remain wearing it until they are in their cubicle or office, behind an appropriate barrier, or otherwise appropriately distanced from others.

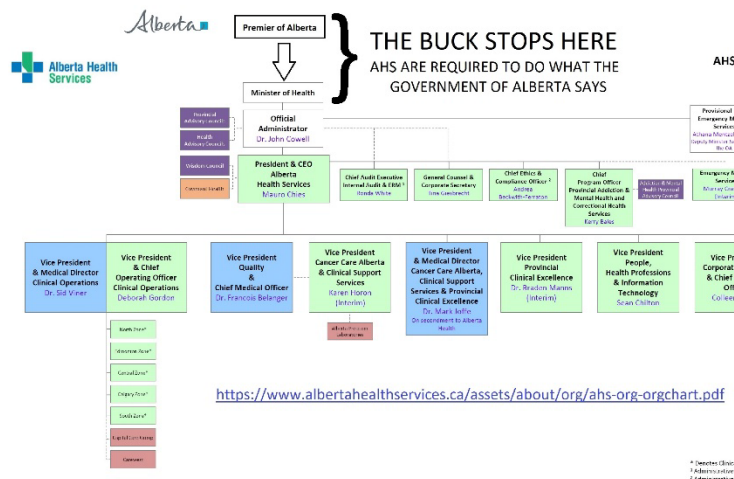

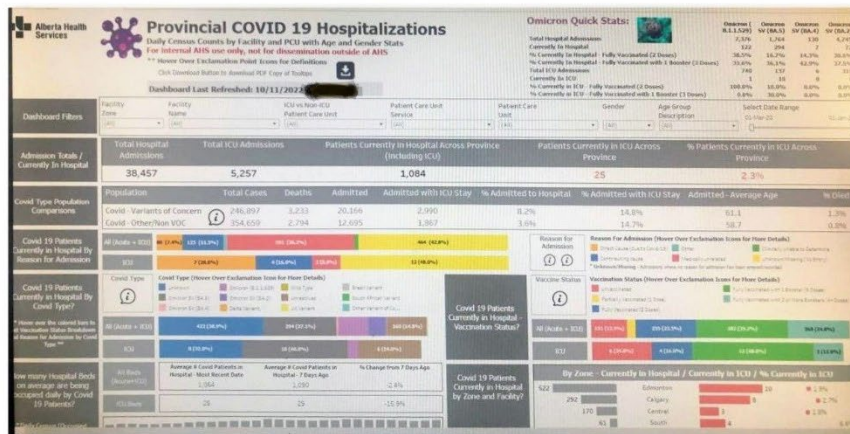
