S. 3.1 (c).

Requires that people *"move freely around to associate, mix or interact" "rather than remaining seated or stationary"*.

S. 3.4.

*"ANY PERSON who attends a private social gathering at an outdoor public or private place MUST maintain a MINIMUM physical distance of TWO METERS from ANY OTHER PERSON attending the private social gathering..."*

This is a government facility using government resources (staff, facility, elevators etc.), no matter who paid for the food and drink. This was a catered patio dining event putting it under S. 5.5 with a limit of 4 persons from the same household or 3 persons who live alone. Again, the "law" was not followed.

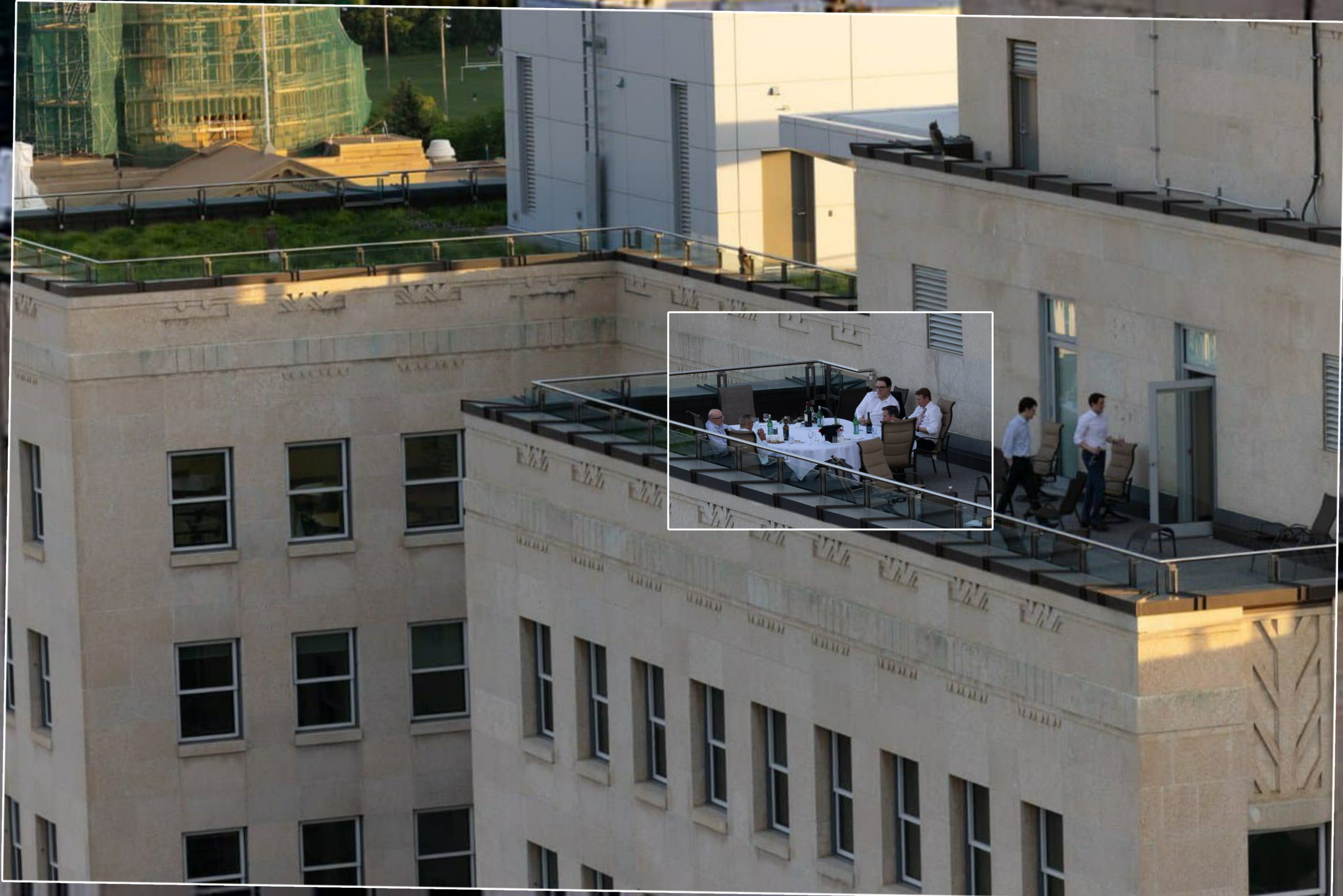

## Part 3 – Private social gatherings

### 3.1 For the purpose of Part 3 of this Order:

- (a) “private place” means a private place as defined under the *Public Health Act*.
- (b) “public place” means a public place as defined under the *Public Health Act*.
- (c) “private social gathering” means any type of private social function or gathering at which a group of persons come together and move freely around to associate, mix or interact with each other for social purposes rather than remaining seated or stationary for the duration of the function or gathering, but does not include:
  - i. a gathering in which all persons are members of the same household; or
  - ii. a gathering in which a person who resides on their own interacts with the two other persons referred to in section 2.3 of this Order.

3.2 All persons are prohibited from attending a private social gathering at an indoor public place, except in accordance with Part 3 of this Order.

3.3 Subject to sections 3.5 and 3.6, and subject to sections 3.8 and 3.9 of this Order, all persons are prohibited from attending a private social gathering at an outdoor private place or public place where eleven or more persons are in attendance at the private social gathering.

3.4 Any person who attends a private social gathering at an outdoor public or private place must maintain a minimum physical distance of two meters from any other person attending the private social gathering unless the other person is a member of their household.



 Table of contents

considered guests (receptions remain prohibited)

- Wedding ceremonies – up to 10 people, including officiant, bride/groom, witnesses (receptions remain prohibited)
- Restaurants – outdoor patio dining for up to 4 household members per table, or 3 people if diners who live alone are with their 2 close contacts
- Retail - 15% of fire code occupancy (must maintain ability to distance)
- Distancing and masking requirements remain in effect



*Mandatory – Effective June 1*

### **Provincewide restriction**

- 10 people maximum if gathering with people outside your household.
  - 2 household cohorts maximum is encouraged.
  - No limit if all participants are part of the same household.

### **Additional safety measures**

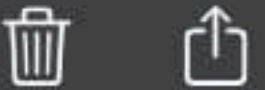
- Mandatory physical distancing must be maintained at all times between members of different households.
- Outdoor gatherings must not have an indoor component (movement in/out of homes is not permitted).
