Members of the public, including disabled people, stood outside the tape while empty seats were a stark indication of overt exclusion. We met one soldier who stood with us, out of uniform, appalled at the display of divisiveness, someone who recognized the imminent threat of tyrannical forces at work. Someone who instinctively knew what was to come. Understand that none of this has gone away.

Remember. Or be condemned to repeat history.

Remember the programming by MSM and tech giants and pharma, the billboards, the marketing, the fear campaign.

Remember the incalculable damage of lockdowns, known to cause harm from the start.

Remember children's playgrounds taped up, marked as exclusion zones.

Remember cities devoid of people.

Remember children denied education, socialization, recreation, access to extended family and friends.
